A Note from the Pastor

For the last several weeks on Sunday mornings, we've been talking about what we do in worship and why. My prayer is that this simple act provides an opportunity to see the way that our ritual (our habits of worship) serve to point us to the truth of the Gospel.

Part of that is gesturing towards the rhythm of worship. I worry that I haven't adequately emphasized the rich symmetry of it all.

Our worship has four basic activities: (#1) we gather, (#2) God speaks and we listen, (#3) we respond to God in faith, thanksgiving, and praise, and (#4) God sends us out into the world.

The gathering and the sending (#1 & #4) are mirrors of one another in the same way that God's word and our reply (#2 & #3) are mirrors of one another.

Paying attention to the subject of the verbs is important, too: **we** gather, **God** speaks, **we** respond, **God** sends. It makes for a nice rhythm. And yet, there's more to it than there may seem to be at first, When we pay close attention, we see that it all starts and ends with God. How and why would we gather if it weren't for God's activity; and what's the point of gathering if God isn't a part of the assembly? And when we reply, it's only because we've been brought from death to life by the divine Word.

And we're active in God's parts too. If God speaks, we're called to listen. And if God sends, we're supposed to go.

God is worthy of our praise. God listens to our prayers. God rejoices in our thanksgiving. God loves a cheerful giver. So we'll sing, we'll pray, and we'll bring our tithes. Maybe we'll even shout for joy.

But I pray we never lose sight of the way that God isn't just the object of our worship, he's the cause. He's not just the destination, he's the one who initiated the whole thing in the first place. And I pray also that we never lose sight of the way that the God who invites us in to worship always sends us out in mission as his hands and feet in the world.

It's never us or God. It's always us and God, God and us, in worship.

Let us love and worship the one who has loved us first and will love us to the end. Amen.


