

On Sunday, I tried to answer the question, "Can I participate in church if I don't believe the theology?" The answer to the question is, of course, a full-throated, "Yes!" If God can love us when we're sinners and enemies, surely, in God's love, we can love those who doubt or deny what we believe. And it's our hope that, in the midst of our community, that God will be evident in a way that assuages doubts and brings comfort, hope, joy, and peace.

While I didn't get to address it in the course of the sermon, there's an often unexplored/undiscussed idea lurking behind this question: What are the things that Christians should/must believe in order to be a Christian? This is the question of dogma.

Closely connected to dogma is the question of Biblical authority.

Must one believe that every character and action in Scripture is historically and scientifically true and verifiable? That every command in scripture must be followed by every Christian today? What about miracles? Angels? Demons?

No one submitted a question directly about Biblical authority, but there are several questions that raise it intrinsically. This week our question is, "What is the role of women in the church?" There are passages of scripture that, taken in isolation, seem to clearly prohibit women from leading in the church in some roles, including the role of pastor. And yet, the United Methodist church has women in leadership in every level of the church.

Does that mean that we don't believe in the authority of scripture? Some would certainly assert that about us. On Sunday, I will try to make the opposite case: that the reason we ordain women is because of the witness and authority of scripture. The difference in our practices and others is not whether the Bible is authoritative, but how it should be read.

Is the Bible authoritative for our faith and behavior? Absolutely? How is it authoritative? That's a question that requires more space than the newsletter affords. I'll hope to see you Wednesday night and Sunday morning as we dip our toe in those waters. Bring a friend!
