If you're looking for a place to start, don't overcomplicate it. Set aside the things weighing you down and distracting you from the goodness of God and run after Jesus who is already blazing the trail. 
**Veterans Day** - November 11<sup>th</sup> is Veterans Day, and we will recognize all our veterans on Sunday, November 9<sup>th</sup>.
