A Note from the Pastor

His master replied, "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness."

Matthew 25:21

As we roll full steam ahead into the Thanksgiving holiday, I've been reflecting on what good comes from being thankful. One of the obvious fruits of giving thanks is the absence of pride; it's hard to give credit to someone else while also taking credit ourselves.

But there's another side effect of thanksgiving that might not be so immediately obvious: resourcefulness. Far too much of our attention gets directed towards what we lack, usually in comparison to our neighbors. "She won't share her toy." "Good grades come easily for them." "I can't afford to be on trend." "I"m just one person." "I don't have enough time."

There's a compelling scene in the movie Apollo 13. After an explosion caused all kinds of damage for the spacecraft, one of the problems was air filtration. The only available filter is square. The one they need to replace is round. Several men go into a room stocked with only the odds and ends available to the astronauts, find a solution, and instruct the astronauts on what to do.

If they had focused on what they didn't have, they would have despaired. Instead, their spirit was, "This is what we have. Let's see what we can do." The giant gap between despair and resourcefulness is bridged with gratitude. Let's give thanks for the things we've got. And let's put them to work for the Master's purposes.

The man with only 1 talent in Matthew 25 doesn't do anything with it. Only getting 1 doesn't seem fair when the others got more. But the master isn't concerned with how many talents they earn; he's concerned with how they use what they have.

The contrast in the parable is astounding: Be faithful— even if it seems like you don't have much—and the master will entrust you with more. On the other hand to offer, if you think you have nothing, you'll be right in the end.

As Thanksgiving comes around, don't neglect giving thanks. And let it be a bridge towards resourcefulness. If you focus on what you have, and not on what you don't, I suspect you'll find a way to use it for the good of the Master.


