A Note from the Pastor

And they brought it. And he saith unto them, Whose is this image and superscription? And they said unto him, Caesar's. And Jesus answering said unto them, Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's. And they marvelled at him.

Mark 12:17 KJV

One of the questions that was asked for our current sermon series that I won't be able to get to was a simple, yet profound one: "Can you preach a sermon on finances?"

One of the reasons that the question is profound is because it's not directly about giving. When we do a stewardship campaign, there's always an ask: What will you give to the church in the coming year? Giving is important. And I hope that the eternal impact that our church hopes to have makes giving to the church one of the most compelling things that you can do with your money.

But thinking about our finances is about so much than our giving. It's about faith: do we trust the Lord to provide our daily bread or do we trust our bank accounts and our insurance plans to provide for us? It's about love: do we love our neighbors as ourselves, or are we keeping/spending in ways that care for our own comforts and pleasures before others needs? It's about worship: do we want to honor God or do we want the status that comes from money and possessions? It's about freedom: do we own our stuff or does our stuff own us?

This verse from Mark is one of my favorites of Jesus' sayings. The religious leaders are trying to get him to choose between God and the empire. And Jesus gives this pithy response. Caesar's picture is on the coin. If you're going to live in Caesar's empire and use his money for trade, you've got to pay Caesar's taxes. But you should render unto God what is God's. And what has God's image on it? Every single person. Our lives belong to God. Our bodies belong to God. Every moment, every thing we love, every bit of energy and activity, give it all to God.

The nitty gritty details of our finances – earning, budgeting, saving, giving – is something I feel we should talk and teach more about. I'm hoping to do something like that soon. In the meantime, if you want to think more about the spiritual components of your finances, come by and let's talk!


