A Note from the Pastor

And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant.

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm;

he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'

(Luke 1:46-55)

For the last two weeks, as we've lit the candles in our Advent wreath, we have prayed together the prayers of women who are overjoyed to be expecting children who will play key roles in God's work to establish his reign on earth. Hannah praises God for the reversal of fortune that comes with the Lord's work: the rich, the poor, the barren, the powerful, the weak and the rulers all find their lives turned upside down (1 Samuel 2:1-10). Mary's prayer shares many of those themes, too, as you can see above.

This coming week, we'll pray the Canticle of Zechariah, which bursts forth exuberantly from him after the birth of his son following months of silence (Luke 1:67-79). He was silenced because he had trouble believing it when an angel told him that he and his wife Elizabeth would have the child that they had given up hope of having. For the last Sunday of Advent, we'll read the song of Simeon, who had been told by the Holy Spirit that he would see the Messiah before he died and recognizes Jesus as the arrival of his salvation. (Luke 2:29-32)

If you're looking for a way to keep the "reason for the season" in front of you, I can't recommend more highly that you pray one or more of these prayers each day. You could pray one of them for the rest of Advent, or alternate between them, or set 4 times in the day and pray one of them at each of those times. Prayer shapes the desires of our hearts and thoughts of our minds. And we could do far worse than remembering in prayer that God is bringing the fullness of salvation to us.
